Landscape irrigation is allowed on the following designated days based on the last digit of your street number. All landscape watering should occur between 7 AM and 10 AM OR 7 PM and 10 PM.

BUILDING FOR THE FUTURE

As more and more development takes place in our region, CLWSC is working to ensure our customers have ample clean and safe drinking water to meet demand.

Did you know that about 50% of capital improvement funding comes from developers that build new subdivisions and develop commercial properties? These funds are used to increase water supplies, enlarge water infrastructure, and expand treatment facilities across our service area.


Additionally, CLWSC is working with other large regional water utilities to develop efficient water supply plans as well as align water conservation efforts to make water usage more effective.

Some of the many multi-year, multimillion dollar projects that will have a positive impact on water distribution and water storage include:




FM 306 TRANSMISSION LINE

CLWSC is replacing six miles of obsolete and deteriorating water transmission lines from Mystic Shores to Hwy 281. For the past several years, new iron pipes have been installed to not only prevent water line breaks (causing unexpected water outages) but also to allow increased water flow on the line to replenish water storage facilities along FM 306 and Hwy 281. The project is 70% complete and is expected to be done in 2020.



HWY 281 FROM GUADALUPE RIVER TO SINGING HILLS

Increased growth in the Spring Branch and Bulverde areas, along with excessive landscape irrigation in the region, caused a severe draw down of water storage in our tanks on Rodeo Drive and in River Crossing. This in turned caused an extended emergency water condition for many customers and prevented landscape irrigation for about four weeks. To address this, new transmission lines are being put into production on Hwy 281 that will increase our ability to move more water more quickly to these storage tanks and allow storage to be replenished rapidly if depleted. Phase 1 and 2 of this project will be completed in early September 2019.



NEW INTERCONNECTION ON FM 3159

CLWSC is accelerating a project to interconnect with a GBRA water transmission line on FM 3159 at Cranes Mill Road. This new connection will provide additional drinking water supplies and allow quicker replenishing of water storage tanks in the Waggner Ranch, Inland Estates, Vintage Oaks and Meyer Ranch subdivisions. The project is currently in the design phase and is expected to complete in Spring 2020.

FALL INTO SPRING: FALL WATER CONSERVATION EVENT

Mark your calendar! CLWSC is partnering with Spring Creek Gardens to put on a special water conservation event the weekend of **November 16 – 17 (10 AM - 5 PM each day)**. Fall Into Spring is a conservation festival focused on helping customers make landscape changes in the fall and winter so plants have time to get established and need less water to survive the heat in spring and summer. Education Stations will cover topics such as selection of drought tolerant and native plants, understanding your irrigation system, tree planting, and more.
